

# Winnie the Pooh in the Hundred Acre Wood

Ahhh, this brings back memories of my childhood. For those of you who have never heard of this game (which is probably most of you), it can be found [here](#), along with several other Sierra kids' games.

The premise of this game: It's a blustery day in the hundred acre wood, and everyone's stuff has been blown all over the place. You have to find all the objects that have been scattered around, and return them to their owners.

The map, in case you get lost or just want to get around faster:



Do not adjust your monitor. This is actually what the graphics looked like. (This is a REALLY OLD game.) For reference, you start in Christopher Robin's playroom in the middle of the bottom row. The objects are randomly placed each time, so I can't tell you where to find them. If you don't know who they belong to, you can take them to Owl (in his treehouse, 3rd row from the bottom) and he will give you a hint.

In case that isn't enough for you...

Object	Owl's Hint	Owner
Toy shovel	"This is a little toy shovel. It's too small for anyone who is big."	Roo (in the sand pit next to Kanga's house)
Baby's scarf	"I think I saw Kanga knitting a scarf like that a long time ago. Maybe it was for her baby."	Roo
Blue crayon	"As far as I know, none of the Animals in the Hundred Acre Wood can write... except me, of course. But, this crayon isn't mine."	Christopher Robin (in his treehouse, one screen south of Rabbit's back door)
Apron	"Someone who likes things neat and clean would certainly use an apron like this."	Kanga
Pine cones	"Pooh made up the game of Pooh Sticks using pine cones just like these. Only later did he begin using sticks instead of pine cones."	The bridge
Broom	"Someone who likes things neat and clean would certainly have a broom like this."	Kanga
Lantern	"With a lantern that bright, you should be able to see who is right in front of you!"	Owl
Turnips	"Which animal eats things that grow under the ground?"	Rabbit
Toy pail	"Anyone who plays in a sand pit needs a toy pail."	Roo
Honey pot	"I can't bear to think that you don't know who owns the honey pot! It must be someone who really loves honey!"	Pooh
Hoe	"If you have a garden, you need a hoe."	Rabbit
"TURNIPS" sign	"Whoo! Whoo! Whoo grows vegetables?"	Rabbit
Rake	"Rakes are for gardens. Which animal has a garden?"	Rabbit
Knitting	"Mothers sometimes knit things for their children. But you knew that, didn't you."	Kanga
Honeysuckle	"These flowers smell so sweet that they make me think of honey. Anyone who loves honey loves honeysuckle."	Pooh
Mirror	"Whoo! Whoo! Whoo is the stoutest in the Hundred Acre Wood?"	Pooh
Very small scarf	"A scarf this small must belong to a very small animal."	Piglet
Tiny pair of mittens	"Tiny mittens? It looks like someone knitted these for a baby."	Roo
Tail	"Why, that's an animal's tail. I should think that any animal without a tail would be very sad."	Eeyore
Large blue balloon	"A balloon this large would make a little boy very happy."	Christopher Robin
Pooh-Coo clock	"I have no idea what this thing is!"	Pooh
Board	"I think it came from a place near the water."	The bridge
Umbrella	"I don't think any animal in the wood has an umbrella. Whoo else is there?"	Christopher Robin
Picnic basket	"It seems to me that somewhere there's a picnic waiting for its basket."	Picnic table
Popped balloon	"An animal with a broken balloon would be very sad."	Eeyore
Coat	"This doesn't look like a coat an animal would wear."	Christopher Robin
Medium-size orange balloon	"This balloon is just the right size for a bear."	Pooh
"CARROTS" sign	"It looks like a sign from someone's garden."	Rabbit
Sticks	"These sticks could be dropped into the water. They'd be perfect for a game of Pooh Sticks."	The bridge
Very small green balloon	"This is a small balloon. It should be given to a very small animal."	Piglet
Thistle	"Only one animal would eat a thistle. You can find him in a sad, gloomy place."	Eeyore
Tablecloth	"This doesn't belong to me or any of my friends' tables. It belongs ON something."	Picnic table
Rain boots	"Since there are only two of them, these must belong to someone with only two feet."	Christopher Robin
Mop	"Someone who is tidy would always have a good mop like this one."	Kanga
